

BIOGRAPHY PAOLO COLOMBO (b.1949)

Artist and curator, Colombo, was born in Turin and currently lives and works in Athens. Drawing and painting have held a fascination for him from a young age. After a career as a curator, which included curating the Iraqi Pavilion at the Venice Biennale (2017); working as curator of the Museo Nazionale delle Arti del XXI Secolo in Rome (2001-2007), and as the director of the Centre d'Art Contemporain in Geneva (1989 – 2000), in 2007 Colombo returned to life as an artist exclusively using pencil and watercolour, the same two forms of media he used from the age of 18.

For Paolo Colombo "economy of means is of paramount importance."



PAOLO COLOMBO VISUAL POETRY

The present large word-based pieces, 'visual poetry', consist of Colombo's distinctive finely painted weave, echoing the earlier use of collage in his practice, effectively appliquéd with his own poetry. From literature studies in Rome, and the important influence and friendship with sculptor, theorist and poet Fausto Melotti (1901-1986), to poetry by Modern Greek poets Cavafis and Seferis, the written word, as well as music, have been consistent and increasingly important sources of inspiration in his work. The lyrics of Rebetika, and traditional Nisiotika music both of which consist of simple texts without adjectives, have also been a source of inspiration to Colombo and adhere to his goal 'to do something, with almost nothing'.

Not only folk music, but folk handicrafts he regards as a sounding board, such as embroideries, costumes, walking sticks. Dots, lines and mosaic tesserae (the equivalent of the dot in Byzantine Art), as well as found objects, have thus evolved with time to become his simple working vocabulary.

Through the interplay of his personally evolved and highly meticulous technique with the ethereal world Colombo evokes through his poetry, the viewer is invited on their own meditative journey.










Study for Wax Wane, 2022 watercolour on paper



PAOLO COLOMBO VIDEOS

Colombo's videos, which have taken shape over the last 4 years, are made of objects found on the beach, a location of important inspiration in Colombo's world. The stone, pebble or piece of rope inspires the characters, and in turn a poem, excerpt of text, lyric, or children's song. The resulting expressive films also tightly follow the artist's goal 'to do something, with almost nothing'.


